Requested items for St. John's (For Lebanon Matthew 25:40 Ministries): Canned goods including: vegetables, fruit, beans, soups, stews, pasta, chili, sloppy Joe, beef, sausage, chicken, salmon, and tuna. Boxed goods including pasta & noodles, rice, mashed potatoes, cereal, oatmeal, stuffing, and mac & cheese. Other pantry staples including flour, sugar, peanut butter, jelly, pasta sauce, BBQ sauce, ramen, cake mix, Jello, and pudding. Nonfood items including trash bags, storage bags, paper towels, toilet paper, dish soap, toiletries.

#### FIRST LESSON: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The Lord's word came to Jonah a second time: "Get up and go to Nineveh, that great city, and declare against it the proclamation that I am commanding you." And Jonah got up and went to Nineveh, according to the Lord's word. (Now Nineveh was indeed an enormous city, a three days' walk across.)

Jonah started into the city, walking one day, and he cried out, "Just forty days more and Nineveh will be over-thrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God. They proclaimed a fast and put on mourning clothes, from the greatest of them to the least significant.

God saw what they were doing—that they had ceased their evil behavior. So God stopped planning to destroy them, and he didn't do it.

#### SECOND LESSON: Psalm 62:5-12

Oh, I must find rest in God only, because my hope comes from him!

Only God is my rock and my salvation – my stronghold! – I will not be shaken.

My deliverance and glory depend on God. God is my strong rock.

My refuge is in God.

All you people: Trust in him at all times! Pour out your hearts before him! God is our refuge!

Human beings are nothing but a breath. Human beings are nothing but lies.

They don't even register on a scale; taken all together they are lighter than a breath!

Don't trust in violence; don't set false hopes in robbery.

When wealth bears fruit, don't set your heart on it.

God has spoken one thing - make it two things - that I myself have heard:

that strength belongs to God, and faithful love comes from you, my Lord – and that you will repay everyone according to their deeds.

#### GOSPEL: Mark 1: 14-20

After John was arrested, Jesus came into Galilee announcing God's good news, saying, "Now is the time! Here comes God's kingdom! Change your hearts and lives, and trust this good news!"

As Jesus passed alongside the Galilee Sea, he saw two brothers, Simon and Andrew, throwing fishing nets into the sea, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow me," he said, "and I'll show you how to fish for people." Right away, they left their nets and followed him. After going a little farther, he saw James and John, Zebedee's sons, in their boat repairing the fishing nets. At that very moment he called them. They followed him, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired workers.
