FOOD PANTRY DONATIONS

With the inflation these past few months, use of local food pantries has been high, and donations have been low. To help our communities we have a donation tub/box for food pantry donations in the sanctuary at St. John's and St. Jacob.

Items for St. John's (For Lebanon Matthew 25:40 Ministries): Canned goods including: green beans, corns, carrots, mixed vegetables, stew, chili, soup, fruit, spaghetti sauce, diced tomatoes, tomato sauce, potatoes (boxed/bags), Rice a Roni, macaroni and cheese, pasta, Ramen noodles, Jello, pudding, peanut butter, jelly, cereal, oatmeal, powdered sugar, brown sugar, oil, Crisco, dish soap, laundry detergent (quart bottles/sheets/pods), dryer sheets, paper towels, toilet paper, (sandwich/qt./gal.) plastic wrap, toilet bowl cleaner, and cleaning solution

FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 2:1-5

- This is what Isaiah, Amoz's son, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.
- In the days to come the mountain of the Lord's house will be the highest of the mountains.
 - It will be lifted above the hills; peoples will stream to it.
- Many nations will go and say,
- "Come, let's go up to the Lord's mountain, to the house of Jacob's God
 - so that he may teach us his ways and we may walk in God's paths."
- Instruction will come from Zion; the Lord's word from Jerusalem.
- God will judge between the nations, and settle disputes of mighty nations.
- Then they will beat their swords into iron plows and their spears into pruning tools.
- Nation will not take up sword against nation; they will no longer learn how to make war.
- Come, house of Jacob, let's walk by the Lord's light.

SECOND LESSON: Romans 13:11-14

As you do all this, you know what time it is. The hour has already come for you to wake up from your sleep. Now our salvation is nearer than when we first had faith. The night is almost over, and the day is near. So let's get rid of the actions that belong to the darkness and put on the weapons of light. Let's behave appropriately as people who live in the day, not in partying and getting drunk, not in sleeping around and obscene behavior, not in fighting and obsession. Instead, dress yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ, and don't plan to indulge your selfish desires.

GOSPEL: Luke 20:27-38 "But nobody knows when that day or hour will come, not the heavenly angels and not the Son.

Only the Father knows. As it was in the time of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Human One. In those days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark. They didn't know what was happening until the flood came and swept them all away. The coming of the Human One will be like that. At that time there will be two men in the field. One will be taken and the other left. Two women will be grinding at the mill. One will be taken and the other left. Therefore, stay alert! You don't know what day the Lord is coming. But you understand that if the head of the house knew at what time the thief would come, he would keep alert and wouldn't allow the thief to break into his house. Therefore, you also should be prepared, be-cause the Human One will come at a time you don't know.
