#### From the Pastor's Desk:

Following the example of the disciples of Jesus, following the rush of Easter activity, I too decided to go fishing. (*John 21:1-19*) Joyce and I went to Reelfoot, and spent a few days enjoying the unmatched natural beauty of the lake, largely undisturbed by any fish requiring catching. Still, it was a good trip, including our evening dinners at 'Boyettes'. Boyette's is an institution at the lake, having served their unique style of meals since 1921. Every dinner, from the three-meat all you can eat, to the modest plate lunch sized portion is served the same way. Every entrée comes with home-made French Fries, onion rings, slaw, hush puppies, rolls and your choice of seasoned green beans or white beans. It is a crazy amount of food. Afterwards the waitresses, in that sweet southern drawl, will ask if "Y'all saved any room for dessert?". One night I asked our waitress if dessert was not the poorest selling item on the menu. She smiled at me, and with a bright twinkle in her eyes exclaimed, "It is! We eat way more than we sell!"

I wonder if what the waitress said about their desserts might also be true about our churches. Much of the best that we have to offer: our amazing fellowship, our deep concern for others, our commitment to children, our joys and our enthusiasms; we ourselves are the biggest consumers. That is not a bad thing! They are not commodities in limited supply. We have plenty and enough to share, but sharing is what we are supposed to be doing.

Consider the disciples in the aftermath of Easter. For years they had been enjoying rather exclusive access to Jesus. They had witnessed the miracles, received the teachings, and lived in his presence. Now, after Easter, they are not sure of what to do. Several of the disciples decide to go back to fishing. But then, the risen Christ returns to them, and gives them their marching orders. "Feed My Sheep!"

The disciples were charged to take all they had seen and heard and experienced, and share it with others. Christ' directions are not too specific. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, the disciples will need to find their own voice, their own way forward; but forward they must go.

And so must we as the churches of Jesus Christ in our own time. We must continually search within our own hearts and imaginations, and trust in the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, to find ways to share the good things we enjoy within our community of faith; to feed the other lambs for whom Christ also died and was raised again.
