From the Pastor's Desk:

Texas Sheet Cake or Cream Puff Cake. At a recent luncheon at church, that was the decision confounding me. Which of those two delectable desserts would I choose? In the end, Religion and Science combined to solve my problem. Religion, with my calendar reminding me that Lent and its traditions of penitence and self-denial was beginning only a few weeks later. It is my customary practice to 'give up' everything sweet for Lent – desserts, soda, chocolate, everything. Science, in the form of logic, told me – better enjoy these treats while I still can. So I took 'em both. BOOM ! Double-desserted it.

(Traditionally, pastors feel required to insert a long list of qualifiers here. How there were tons and tons of desserts so nobody else would run short, or how I ate a light lunch to save room for the desserts. Forget about it. It was time to 'get while the getting was good.' I may have smuggled a piece of Dump Cake out in a to-go box.)

With Ash Wednesday rapidly approaching, others among us might be making similar considerations. What will we be 'giving up for Lent.' I intend to keep my usual tradition, but am considering a slightly different approach, especially as it regards our mid-week Lenten services.

Fear not ! We will continue to enjoy our Wednesday evening fellowship meals, and most times there will be desserts. However, following the meal this year, instead of guest mission speakers, we will be participating in a short Bible study and guided reflection on *Giving Up Something Bad for Lent !*

If we are going to engage in the spiritual discipline of giving up something for Lent, might we consider giving up some negative attitude, habit or practice that really negatively affects us? And if we can engage in denying ourselves these bad things for the forty days of Lent, maybe we can keep rid of them permanently. Imagine how our lives might be if we could give up envy, jealousy, resentment or negative thinking, and not just for Lent, but with God's help, forever.

Please consider joining us on Wednesday evenings during Lent when we will be enjoying great fellowship meals, and prayerfully considering what we might be giving up *BAD* for Lent.

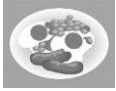

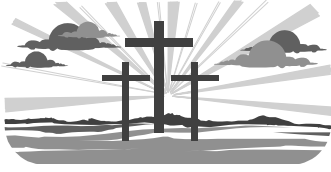

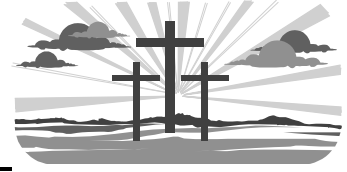
