### ABOUT THIS TIME OF YEAR

About this time of year, there will often appear printed in some newspaper a contribution to the editor submitted by someone who thinks themselves clever. They will denounce Easter as a "pagan holiday". Such a pronouncement is not surprising Lots of ridiculous things are being said and published nowadays, but the notion that Easter is a pagan holiday is particular foolishness. Easter is the primary Christian holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ the Lord. Period.

It is true that the English word "Easter" has pagan connotations that pre-date Christianity. As early as the 8th century the NAME for Easter was likely derived from the Anglo-Saxon spring goddess Eostre.

You see, the NAMES that we use — indeed, our entire vocabulary — is filled with pagan references of Anglo-Saxon, Norse, Germanic, and Roman gods and goddesses, since the vocabulary developed before Christianity. Many of the names and traditions associated with our modern Christian observances may have originated in pagan practices, but they have been converted, just as people were and still are converted today, to serve the purposes of the Risen Lord Jesus. The CONTENT of Easter — at least as true Christians practice it — is a celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Easter bunnies and baby chicks and eggs may have had their origins as pagan symbols of Spring, but they have been repurposed to a higher calling, to point the way to the promise of new and eternal life revealed on Easter morning.

Don't get hung up on the name "Easter." Focus on the joy we celebrate when we recall Jesus' rising from the dead on that Sunday morning, that "Easter" morning, 20 centuries ago.
