#### Dear Church Family and Friends of St. Jacob and St. John's,

I have an admission to make. I am not a summer person. I would always rather have a cold winter day where I can bundle up and go outside for a long hike instead of a muggy summer day where you go outside and your clothes feel like you just jumped into a pool. But when it comes to summer, the moisture and warmth of the sun means that plants and crops grow far better than in the frigid days of winter. Both winter and summer have their pros and their cons.

This isn't too different than our time in the church. Throughout winter and spring things are exciting around church. We have the end of Advent and Christmas marking the birth of Jesus. We have a few weeks to get ready while we celebrate Jesus' baptism by John, but then we jump right into Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. It sometimes feels like we are moving at a breakneck pace. Then, after Trinity Sunday, things seem to slow down. The altar cloth and paraments in the sanctuary turn green, not unlike the plants turn our gardens and fields green this time of year.

On church calendars this is called "Ordinary Time", but it is anything but ordinary. Since we celebrate Jesus' birth, death and resurrection only a few months apart we only get to hear a few snippets of what Jesus actually does during his three years of ministry in Galilee. But now, in this "Ordinary Time" we will hear about those whom Jesus heals. We will learn Jesus' teachings alongside the disciples, and we will see how he tries, and sometimes even succeeds, in teaching the Pharisees and Scribes. We will send our youth and children off to DuBois Center. We will prepare lunches for kids to try and ensure, just as Jesus did with the five thousand, that no one goes hungry. And, most extraordinarily, it is this time of the year where we can join with all of those plants and grow in the warmth of the Son.

So enjoy the summer, whether you enjoy it by being outside in the sun, or relish your air conditioning and shade. And enjoy this un-ordinary time as learning and loving people of God.




















# **STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL A SUCCESS!**


#### **RALLY DAY SET FOR SEPT. 18**

#### **DUBOIS 6.0 CAMPAIGN UPDATE**

DuBois Center turns 60 in 2022. While the first 60 years have been great, DuBois Center needs some maintenance and expansion to get it ready for the next 60. DuBois has begun a Capital Campaign with a goal \$225,290 to meet those needs. Dubois Center is approaching \$190,000 for a total donation as of June 21. There are several projects that have been completed. But since camp is in full swing, some projects have been funded but not completed so as not to interfere with the kids at camp.

- --Program Director's House Improvements


#### Projects that have been funded, but not yet completed:


