Dear Church Family and Friends of St. John's and St. Jacob,

As I write this, the last of this winter's snow is finally melting. At least I hope it's the last of the snow. This winter has felt like a long one and I, for one, am ready for spring. But as we move toward the start of spring, we also begin our observation of Lent, the time when we are called to examine ourselves, asking if we are living in the way Jesus has taught us.

One of the effects of this most recent snow and ice was the postponing of the final session of our winter bible study on the Ten Commandments. Over four weeks we've talked through all Ten, asking and answering questions, but one of the things we kept in mind is that these Commandments weren't simply given to the individual members of the Israelite people. When Moses came down from Mount Sinai he gave the Commandments to the whole community. At the time the Israelites had just gained their freedom from slavery in Egypt. They hadn't governed themselves for generations and while Egypt had a robust set of laws to follow, those laws seldom protected the Israelite slaves. So now God was giving them a new law that would help them live as good individuals, but more importantly, would help them live together and care for one another as a community.

Hundreds of years later, Jesus was asked which of these commandments was the most important. His answer was to love God with all your heart and soul and mind, and love your neighbor as yourself. He reminded his listeners, and all of us, that love was the key to a healthy and happy community. And the apostle Paul makes it even more plain when he writes that the commandments "are all summed up in one word: *You must love your neighbor as yourself.* Love doesn't do anything wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is what fulfills the Law." (Romans 13:9b-10, CEB)

In addition to it feeling like a long winter, these last few weeks have also left many feeling uneasy. Looking around our world at unending war and conflict and looking at our nation where the poor and those on the margins of society feel ever more threatened, many of us are wondering where the Spirit of God is working during this time. And the answer is God is working in us.


