Dear Church Family and Friends of St. John's and St. Jacob,

Every week during worship we take just a bit of time to read and learn about a few verses of scripture taken from a longer section of the text, but we seldom have the opportunity to really spend time digging into such a longer section. In an effort to change that, this fall we're taking time to delve into the whole reading of the Sermon on the Mount.

Of course, we do read the Sermon on the Mount as a part of our regular Sunday scripture readings. Once every three years the Sermon is spread across six Sundays and Ash Wednesday as a part of our lectionary readings, but even then, we only hear about 70% of it. This fall, our adult bible study will be read the whole of the Sermon and then spend six sessions discussing each part of the Sermon in detail, including the Beatitudes and the Lord's Prayer.

So, I invite you to come and join in our study of the Sermon on the Mount. Come and learn more about the text that is often described as "A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven".

We will be gathering on the first and third Wednesdays at St. Jacob UCC at 10 a.m., in the Heritage Hall or at 7 p.m., in the office meeting space, beginning on September 3rd.
